Graduates who meet criteria for the scholarship scheme award can apply for a Bachelor's Degree at university level or an internship programme with other institutions abroad.

Rationale

The Diploma Graphic Design Programme plays a formative role at the level of tertiary education in that it provides learners with the necessary artistic skills and knowledge, essential for the world the work. Training in Graphic Design is geared mainly towards sustaining the creative industries, and the development of Arts and Culture in Seychelles. In recent years the Graphic Design industry has expanded and is in high demand as a consequence of computer and internet opportunities. It is often argued that the ultimate importance of graphic design as a profession is its impact on business since it holds a predominant place in the competitive world of communication.

The Programme should allow learners to develop effective visual communication skills and make aesthetic judgments while exploring a variety of materials, processes and techniques. Secondly, learners are exposed to the historical background to the subject whilst developing a critical vocabulary to evaluate their own work, which will ultimately influence new ideas and responses. Thirdly, the programme should enable learners to become more creative with necessary life skills especially when solving problems through emphasis on project-based work.

Learners can exit upon completion of the Advanced Certificate level or proceed to another year to complete the programme at Diploma level.
